

## MEMORY-1

Place the 12 cards on the table, **face down**, forming a **rectangle** (of 3x4 cards). Next, every player in his turn, turns up two cards. **If they make a pair** (according to the rules in each play, as we will explain later), **he keeps them**. If they don't, he puts them on the table again, in the same position as they were (face down).

The game **is over when all the cards have been matched**. **The winner is the player with more pairs**.

### ✍ Version A: ADD UP 10

The player will add up the points of the two turned cards. **They will make a pair when the sum is 10.**

### ✍ Version B: THE SAME QUANTITY

Now the player will look at the quantity represented by each card. **They will make a pair if they represent the same quantity.**

### ✍ Version C: SAME DIFFERENCE

In this last version, what the player has to do is the subtractions shown in each card. **They will make a pair if the results of the subtractions are the same.**

### YOU WILL NEED (EACH TEAM):

A set of 12 cards, that will represent:

- ✍ The numbers 0,1,2,3,4,5,5,6,7,8,9 and 10 for version A
- ✍ The numbers 1,2,10,12,20 and 21, written as numbers and as units and tens, for version B

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
